

PMDC CONTEST - COIN SHOOTER'S CHALLENGE

Currently Canada has five denominations of coins in general use. These are commonly referred to as the toonie, loonie, quarter, dime and nickel. Of course we all know that these are not their official designations.

The Contest

Using your metal detector, find one each of the five Canadian coins listed above. That is five coins in total. Add together the issue dates of your five coins. For example if your coins all bear the date 2000 then your total and your score will be 10,000. The object of this contest will be to obtain the lowest score.

The Rules:

- This contest begins at the October meeting and ends at the November meeting.
 Coins must be found while metal detecting.
 - 3. Coins found while participating in any seeded hunt do not qualify.
 - 4. All coins must be Canadian. U.S. and other foreign coins do not qualify.

The Prizes:

Prizes will be announced at the November meeting. Everyone who participates will have a chance to win a prize but you must have found the five required coins and show them at the next meeting.

Huntmaster's Tips:

Every time you find one of the five coins check the date against others that you have already found. Keep the earliest date. Remember you want the lowest total of the five dates


