

The Loonie Lotto

Contest:

Every monthly meeting, members who have found Loonies during that month (from the last meeting to the current meeting) **choose one** of them to enter the contest and that Loonie will go in a pot. One token representing each year a Loonie was minted is put into a jar and one is drawn. The member who has the Loonie of the same year as the Token wins the **Pot.**

Rules:

- The Loonie entered must have been found while metal detecting.
- Only a Loonie found after the previous monthly meeting can be entered.
- Only one Loonie can be entered per game. So if you found several...choose one but the others cannot be entered at the following monthly meeting.
- Each Member places his or her Loonie on the table where the Hunt Master can see it.
- Hunt Master draws one Token from the Token Jar
- The Member with the corresponding year wins all the entered Loonies.
- If more than one winner, the Pot is divided accordingly.
- If no one has the winning Loonie, all Loonies go into the **Pot** and the **Pot** is carried to the next Monthly Meeting.

- The Token that was drawn is retired from future draws. So pay attention not to enter a year already called. Check the monthly newsletter!
- A Member who joins the game after having missed one or more meetings must equalize their entries into the game by contributing as many Loonies as meetings missed.

Tip #1: If you find more than one Loonie during the month, remember that the mintage of loonies varies widely from year to year. If you can, it would be a smart play to enter a year with the lowest mintage. Then hope that most of the other players enter a loonie from one of the higher mintage years. When your year is drawn, you may not have to split the pot. Mintage years and production can be viewed at the following link:

World of Detectors - What's New

XP Metal Detectors:

Deus: Last update Version 5.2 on Sept 13, 2018

ORX: Medium-end detector announced on Sept 14, 2018. Two gold modes, two coin & relic modes and two user modes. Freq range 13 to 81 kHz; One HF coil (22 cm round or 24/13 cm elliptical); X35 coils optional. 5 year warranty. Price: Approx. C\$1200.

Availability: Soon!!!

Note: The XP ORX appears to be an updated version of the XP – DPR600 released in 2016 to Africa only. This model does not have the Oscilloscope.

Nokta/Makro:

After merging of the two companies Nokta and Makro 4 years ago, they finally decided to stop producing 2 lines of metal detectors in 2018. Coming up is the *Anfibio* which besides some cosmetic upgrades appears to be a rebranding of the *Multi-Kruzer*. Expected Release date: October 2018. Price US\$900. Next, the *Simplex*, an entry level detector waterproof and wireless; expected release early 2019. Price US\$250-400 depending on model. Lastly, an all new *Simultaneous Multi-Frequency (SMF)* detector still in development and no name yet. The company has set up a contest for input from users for what they want to see in a detector as well as a *Name* for it. They claim to have the SMF worked out but they want to have users tell them what features they want in a detector. No release date and no price.

Tesoro:

"Unconfirmed" by the company, news from various blogs on the web reporting that Tesoro had laid off all their factory floor staff.
